LIST OF COMPLETED PROJECTS FOR 2022

THE AUBURN PARKS DEPARTMENT HAD ANOTHER BUSY YEAR AND IS PROUD TO HAVE WORKED ANOTHER YEAR WITHOUT A RECORDABLE ACCIDENT. THIS MAKES THE FOURTH YEAR IN A ROW!

THIS YEAR WE WERE ABLE TO BRING IN SOME OUTSIDE WORK GROUPS THAT WERE A HUGE HELP IN COMPLETING WORK THAT REQUIRES MORE PEOPLE THEN WE HAVE AVAILABLE, SUCH AS MULCHING (PLAYGROUNDS, TRAILS, FLOWING BEDS, AND TREES), PAINTING DUGOUTS, PICKING UP LIMBS AFTER STORMS, EDGING SIDEWALKS, AND MANY OTHER PROJECTS.

THANK YOU TO THE UNITED WAY DAY OF CARING, DEKALB HIGH SCHOOL'S GIRLS VOLLEYBALL TEAM, DEKALB HIGH SCHOOL'S TENNIS TEAM, GIRL SCOUTS, AND WORK GROUPS FROM THE FIRST UNITED METHODIST CHURCH AND TEMPUS TECHNOLOGIES FOR THEIR HELP. WE ALSO STARTED USING COMMUNITY SERVICE PEOPLE AGAIN AND HAD SEVERAL HUNDRED HOURS OF WORK PERFORMED THIS YEAR. ANOTHER HIGHLIGHT OF THE YEAR WAS WORKING WITH A BOY SCOUT AND ASSISTING HIM IN INSTALLING A BICYCLE REPAIR STATION AT RIEKE PARK TRAIL.

WE WERE ABLE TO COMPLETE MANY PROJECTS DESPITE THE CONTINUING COVID CHALLENGES. THE MAINTENANCE STAFF MOWS ALL THE PARKS AND RECREATION GROUNDS, WHICH CONSISTS OF 18 PARKS AND PROPERTIES AND TOTALS OVER 112 ACRES OF CUTTABLE GRASS. WE AVERAGE AROUND 70-MAN HOURS PER WEEK AND OVER 2,000-MAN HOURS PER YEAR SPENT MOWING.

PARK ROUNDS ARE ANOTHER IMPORTANT JOB THAT WE COMPLETE. WE CHECK EACH PARK DAILY TO CLEAN RESTROOMS, EMPTY TRASH CANS, CHECK FOR GROUND TRASH, AND A VARIETY OF OTHER THINGS. WE PREP AND MANAGE TWO ADULT SOFTBALL FIELDS AT RIEKE PARK AND HAVE FIVE OTHER BALL FIELDS THAT WE PERFORM MAINTENANCE ON. WE ALSO HAVE TWO RENTABLE BUILDINGS THAT WE MANAGE, WHICH REQUIRE A CLEANING AFTER EACH USE. ALL OF THIS TOTALS OVER 3,132-MAN HOURS A YEAR.

THROUGHOUT THE WINTER MONTHS, WE PERFORM A FULL SERVICE AND MAINTENANCE ON ALL THE PARK'S EQUIPMENT. OIL AND OTHER FLUIDS ARE CHANGED AS NEEDED, SPARK PLUGS, FILTERS, BEARINGS, EVERYTHING IS GREASED, AND DETAILED CLEANING IS PERFORMED. DAMAGED AND WORN PARTS ARE REPLACED.

WE WERE ABLE TO ADD A F-650 DUMP TRUCK TO OUR FLEET TO AID IN THE PROPER MAINTENANCE OF THE PARK SYSTEM.
